

Sunburst

Finished quilt: 88" X 88"

Finished Block: 16" X 16"



Class description

Inspired by American Folk Art quilts, this block is perfect for spring or summer project. The question one might ask, if it's possible to make a Sunburst block with Dresden plate centers without any templates and applique. The answer is, yes!

This four day class is designed to focus on cutting multiple curves through layers of fabrics and sewing the pieces into Free Form flower blocks. It is easy and fast.

Sujata will share many tips on making the Pinwheel blocks and offer suggestions for color combinations and layouts during the class. You may not stop at just one.

Yardage Requirements for the quilt top

Blocks and Borders

1/2 yard each of 25 colorful, contrasting prints and solids for the blocks

Tools

Sewing Machine

Medium size cutting mat

Rotary cutter with fresh blade

6" x 12" ruler with

2-3 sheets of freezer paper

Scissors

Rotating Mat (optional)

9" or 12" Square ruler

Pre-Class homework

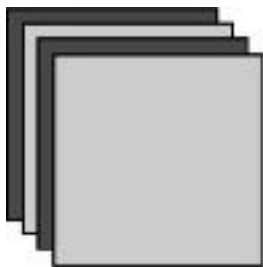
Pre-wash and iron fabrics if preferred.

Follow the cutting instructions and pre-cut squares.

Cutting the fabrics

From each 1/2 yard:

Cut 1 strip 11" X width of the fabric. Crosscut 2 squares 11" x 11"



Make 25 stacks of squares each containing 2 squares of each of the two prints. With right sides up, arrange them in alternating order. Pin each stack for easier handling.
